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Importance of Flu Shots

Why Prevention Matters

- Flu can have serious consequences. During the 2025–2026 season, the CDC estimates **32–57 million illnesses, 390,000–800,000 hospitalizations, and 24,000–81,000 deaths since October 2025.**
- Vaccination is an important prevention tool. **Annual flu vaccination can help reduce the risk of flu illness and its complications**, helping protect individuals and those around them.
- Flu impacts more than health. Illness can lead to **missed work, reduced productivity and disruptions for employees, families and employers.**
- Every vaccination helps strengthen protection. Declining vaccination rates, especially among children and pregnant people, **can increase vulnerability to vaccine-preventable diseases and their complications.**

Importance of Flu Shots



Who Has Higher Risk

- Adults age 65 and older
- Young Children 5 and under
- Pregnant women
- People with certain chronic health conditions, including asthma, diabetes, and heart disease
- People with weakened immune systems

How to Protect Yourself

- Wash your hands for 30 seconds with soap and water
- Distance from those who are sick and showing symptoms
- Get the flu vaccine each year

Small Steps. Healthier Teams. Stronger Workplaces.

1. *Reduces Absenteeism*

Flu causes significant missed workdays: The CDC estimates that up to 111 million workdays are lost annually due to the flu, costing employers over \$16 billion in lost productivity.

Vaccinated individuals are less likely to get sick: Even if they contract the flu, vaccinated employees typically experience milder symptoms and recover faster, minimizing time off.

2. *Prevents Workplace Outbreaks*

Flu spreads easily in close-contact settings: Workplaces, especially shared offices, break rooms, and production floors, are ideal environments for transmission. Vaccination reduces community spread: The more employees who are vaccinated, the less likely it is that the virus can circulate.

Herd immunity effect: When a high percentage of staff is vaccinated, it helps protect those who can't receive the vaccine for medical reasons.

3. *Demonstrates Employer Commitment to Health*

Offering flu shots or promoting them shows that your organization:

- Values employee health and safety
- Is proactive in preventing health-related disruptions
- Supports a culture of wellness and responsibility

On-Site Flu Shot Clinics

UnitedAg partners directly with member employers to coordinate convenient, on-site flu shot clinics at worksites and regional hubs. Available to member groups with 25+ participants within 25–30 miles of a regional clinic.

UnitedAg Wellness Clinics

Members can also receive flu shots at any of the six UnitedAg Health & Wellness Clinics with zero out of pocket costs. *Walk-in or appointment-based, these clinics offer flexible options for employees and families.

In Network Pharmacies

In addition to on-site and clinic-based options, UnitedAg members can also receive their annual flu shot at any in-network pharmacy within the Costco Pharmacy network. This added convenience ensures members have multiple accessible options for flu prevention.

HOSTING ONSITE FLU SHOT EVENTS

Onsite Flu Shot Events

Each year, UnitedAg runs a coordinated Flu Shot Awareness Campaign to help employers:

- Schedule their clinics early (beginning of fall)
- Promote participation through posters, email templates, and social media content
- Educate employees on flu prevention, symptoms, and myths



HOSTING ONSITE FLU SHOT EVENTS



UnitedAg partners directly with member employers to bring flu vaccinations to the heart of the workforce. These onsite flu shot clinics are designed with convenience and efficiency in mind—ensuring that employees have easy access to ***preventive care without having to leave the worksite.***

- Start date: Monday, September 21, 2026
- Event Hours: Monday – Friday between 7:00 AM – 6:00 PM
- Vaccine: FLUZONE Trivalent, 0.5 mL Prefilled Syringes
- Non-Insured Pricing: \$32.00 for non-insured individuals
- Available to member groups with 30+ or more participants (25 guaranteed)
- Worksites must be located within 25–30 miles of a UnitedAg Regional Health & Wellness Clinic
- Clinics are coordinated in partnership with the employer to meet workforce scheduling needs
- Ideal for large crews, harvest teams, and ag operations with limited access to outside healthcare
- Final counts must be provided 36 hours prior to the event to ensure enough flu shots are available.

By eliminating barriers such as transportation, scheduling, and cost, these mobile services encourage greater participation and ***protect entire workforces during peak flu season.***

HOW TO GET STARTED

Inquiry Submission

Member group submits a flu shot event request via Monday.com.

②

Scheduling Review

The Clinical Team will review the request and confirm the date/time.

③

Event Confirmation & Pre-Event Communication

The UnitedAg Communications Team will contact the company representative with:

- Confirmed event date and time
- Digital registration forms, waivers, and promotional flyers/posters
- Day-of-event setup instructions and logistics
- All communication will include Client Services and Field Staff as copied recipients.

④

Travel Fee Notification (if applicable)

Any applicable travel fees for locations outside the service radius will be disclosed in advance.

Note: Groups located outside of the eligible radius will incur an onsite travel fee.
This fee will be communicated prior to event confirmation.

Final Participant Count

Must be submitted 36 hours before the event to ensure adequate vaccine supply.
