Timeline

- March 15:
 - Governor announced he was encouraging those 65 + and those vulnerable to COVID-19 to self-isolate; for bars, night clubs, wineries, and breweries to close; and restaurants to focus on takeout or cut capacity.
 - Los Angeles closed bars, restaurants, gyms, entertainment
 - Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, San Francisco, San Mateo, and Santa Clara, and Santa Cruz along with the city of Berkley, issued a shelter orders
- March 16:
 - Legislature passed SB 89 and SB 117 and recessed until April 13
 - Governor aligned state policy with counties and discouraged gatherings
- March 19: Governor issued a statewide stay at home order
