Service	Description
Covid-19 test- Corona virus is a type of disease that can spread from person to person. Spreads mainly through respiratory droplets, add such as, coughing, sneezing, or talking.	Nasal swab to determine if you are negative or positive for corona virus. Results takes within 48-72 hours of test.
Tuberculosis - Tuberculosis is a serious disease which mainly affects the lungs. It can spread from one person to another such as tiny droplets released into air (sneezing, and coughing)	Test done on the forearm to see if you have been exposed to tuberculosis, requires a reading within the forearm 48-72 hours.
Hair Follicle testing - Screens for illicit drug use and the misuse of prescription medication.	A small amount of hair is removed from your head, the sample is then analyzed for signs of drug use during the 90 days preceding the test.
Alcohol Screen (Saliva) - Screening test used to detect ethyl alcohol in human saliva. Requires a small amount of salvia to detect relative blood alcohol greater or equal to 0.02% BAC (blood alcohol content)	Rapid Saliva test to check if there are any alcohol in the system.
COC Urine (Collection only) - Chain of custody urine collection is a urine sample collected to determine if you have drugs or alcohol in your system.	Urine test to determine if there are drugs in your system. Negative results take 24 hours non-negative takes 24 to 72 hours.
COC Breathalyzer- A device used for estimating blood alcohol content from a breath sample	A machine you breathe into to check your alcohol blood level.
Hep B vaccine- Recombinant is used to prevent infection by the hepatitis B virus. The vaccine works by causing your body to produce its own antibodies against the disease.	A serious liver infection caused by Hep B virus; Vaccine is given as a two or three dose series, depending on the age you first received the vaccine.
Hep B Titer- Titer testing measures the antibodies level, indicate that a person is immune to a particular virus or infection.	To determine if they need the Hep B vaccines, they will need to draw blood to measure the level of antibodies.
Tetanus- Bacterial infection that causes painful muscle spasms that affects the nerves. Once vaccine is injected the toxoid elicits and immune response against the toxin.	The tetanus shot will prevent you from getting an infection caused by a deep cut, burns, bites.

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Rapid Drug 5 Panel- Rapid tests point is to collect testing, provides on-site screening for drugs of the abuse, urine specimen validity and saliva alcohol.	Collection of urine is needed to do a drug test; test will be read within 5 mins.
Mask fit test- Conducted to ensure the respirator is properly fitted to individual's face type to provide the safest protection. Test involves the taste sensitivity of the person being tested.	Mask fit testing is done by performing a fit test on you while you wear the same make mode, size of respirator that you will be using on the job.
CBC- Group of tests that evaluate the cells that circulate in blood, including red blood cells, white blood cells, and platelets. CBC can evaluate your overall health and detect a variety of diseases and conditions.	Blood draw to review the cells in your body to see if you have any blood disorders, it checks for infections, anemia and leukemia.
Cholinesterase- Blood test that looks at levels of 2 substances that help the nervous system work properly also called Acetylcholinesterase , our nerves need these substances to send signals.	Blood drawn to detect acute poisoning or to monitor those with occupational exposure such as to chemicals, farm workers, or those who work with industrial chemicals.
Urinalysis- A urinalysis is used to detect and manage a wide range of disorders, such as urinary tract infections, kidney disease and diabetes.	Urine test to detect if you have any sort of disorder such as UTI, Kidney disease and diabetes and more.
Employment Physical- Employment physical is an exam to assure employees are physically and mentally able to take on the responsibilities of a job.	Physical done to determine if you are fit for the job.
DMV Medical Exam- Documents prepared by a Physician, Physician's Assistant, Nurse Practitioner, or Chiropractor to document driver meets the national medical standards necessary to operate a commercial vehicle.	Physical/documents required and filled out by practitioner to make sure you are eligible to drive commercial vehicle.
X-Ray 2 views- Changing the relative orientation of the body and the direction of the x-ray beam. The most common views are posteroanterior, anteroposterior, and lateral.	2 view x-ray includes the front and back view to vague.
X-Ray Lumber Spine- Abnormal curves of the spine. Abnormal wear on the cartilage and bones of the lower spine, such as bone spurs and narrowing of the joints between the vertebrae.	X-ray of small bones in the lower part of the spine.

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
